

**RULES FOR ENTERING SPAIN (FROM EU/SCHENGEN) FOR CITIZENS OF THE UNION AND THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS, AND OTHER BENEFICIARIES OF THE RIGHT TO FREE MOVEMENT:**

According to Order INT/657/2020, **EU/Schengen citizens** may enter Spain without border restrictions. However, **they must comply with the health regulations** established in the Resolution of June 4, 2021 (BOE-A-2021-9352):

- **Fill out and sign the SpTH (Spain Travel Health) form** associated with their trip, regardless of their nationality, age or any other consideration. You can download this form at [this link](#).

- Provide any of the following three certificates:

**a) Vaccination certificate** that proves having received the **complete COVID-19 vaccination regimen at least 14 days prior to arrival in Spain**. In addition to the above, in order to be accepted by the health authorities this certificate must meet the following conditions:

- The vaccination must have been carried out with one of the vaccines recognized by the European Medicines Agency or the World Health Organization and the vaccination certificate must include at least the following information:

1. Name and surname of the holder.
2. Date of vaccination, indicating the date of the last dose administered. 3.
3. Type of vaccine administered.
4. Number of doses administered/complete schedule.
5. Issuing country.
6. Identification of the body issuing the vaccination certificate. **If you reside in England**, the Spanish authorities recognize the NHS App or the NHS letter explaining your vaccination schedule as proof of entry into Spain.

**b) Negative certificate of a COVID-19 Active Infection Diagnostic Test** with the following conditions:

- Admissible tests are as follows: NAAT (PCR, LAMP, TMA) or antigen test included in the common list of rapid antigen detection tests for COVID-19.

- In the case of the **PCR certificate**, the sample must have been taken within **72 hours prior to arrival in Spain**; in the case of the **antigen test**, the sample must have been taken **within 48 hours prior to entry into Spain**.

**c) Certificate of recovery, confirming that the holder has recovered from COVID-19** issued by the competent authority or by a medical service with the following conditions:

- At least 11 days after the completion of the first NAAT diagnostic test with a positive result.

- The validity of the certificate will end 180 days from the date the sample was taken.

Please note that quarantine may be required upon your return to your home country. Please follow the instructions given by the Health Department of your home country prior to your return.
